Player of the Week: Sally Baumgartner, Bainbridge

Monday April 23rd, 2007

Overlake at Lakeside

Lakeside continues their undefeated streak, beating Overlake 17-2.

Lakesides Brett Eisenhart earned seven game points between three goals and four assists, in addition to two forced turnovers, two draws and five ground balls. Gracie Binder led her team in goals with four, along with two assists, and two forced turnovers and five ground balls.
