Player of the Week: Gracie Binder, Lakeside

Tuesday April 3rd, 2007

Forest Ridge at Roosevelt

Forest Ridge rebounded from their close loss to Mercer Island last week to beat Roosevelt 15-9.

Maddy Phillips dominated the attack with a whopping seven goals and one assist for Forest Ridge. Nisa McCormick-Orozco added three goals along with four assists, while Jillian Chong netted two goals and produced three assists. Malena Harrang also netted two in addition to an assist. The remaining goal was scored by Courtney Yorozu. Defensively, Chong led with three forced turnovers, while McCormick-Orozco, Phillips and Anna Ross each had two. Goalie Joni Sliger saved 11.
