Player of the Week: Jillian Chong, Forest Ridge

Monday March 26th, 2007

North Kitsap at Seattle Prep

Seattle Prep found their first win of the season, while North Kitsap remained in search of victory as Seattle Prep beat Kitsap 18-4 on Monday.

Lauren Murray, fifth in the league for ppg (points per game) led the offensive charge against North Kitsap with four goals and three assists. Cat Snider and Sydney Dahl each knocked in three more, while Laura Hagen, Cait Slack and Anna Timberlake put in two a piece. Cassedy O'Neill managed three assists in addition to her goal, while Annie Hunter put in one goal and gave an assist. Additional assists were made by Hagen (2), Slack (1), Snider (1) and Timberlake (1). Defensive standout Taylor Green dominated with seven turnovers and eight ground balls. Hagen and Timberlake each controlled the draw with six and five consecutively. Maddie Ferguson also forced three turnovers for her team's defensive effort. Goalie Malia Makowicki walked away with 73% saves, 11 of 15.

North Kitsap has two goals accounted for, one by Xan Dammarell and the other by Hilary Grob. Alison Benny contributed an assist. Alva Davalos played a strong defensive game forcing three turnovers and digging up five along with Hilary Grob who also forced three turnovers.

Lake Sammamish at Mercer Island
